PACCC Welcomes an Additional 70 Children from ELOP Waitlist!

PACCC actively works to eliminate barriers to access and advocate for affordable and accessible childcare options for all families. We are thrilled to announce that we accepted another 70 children into our Kids' Clubs from PAUSD's Expanded Learning Opportunity Program (ELOP) waitlist! We are honored to expand our programs and continue to look for ways to expand our reach to Palo Alto's children.

As noted in PAUSD's recent newsletter, "PACCC continues to support local working families via government and private funding. As part of the Education Code, the legislature has focused on programs that supplement school-day learning. Such additions are intended to not only augment academic needs, but also support the emotional, physical, and social needs of children both before and after school and also during summer or intersession learning programs."

So, when the <u>Solving Fun Learning Kits</u> arrived at PACCC, we didn't furrow our brow; we handed them over to the experts – our students! PACCC has Partnered with Site for Sore Eyes!

We're thrilled to partner with PACCC parent, Dr. Cindy Pouw at Site for Sore Eyes in Palo Alto.

Did you know that 80% of learning occurs through vision? 1 in 4 children have an undetectable vision problem that can affect school performance, confidence, and behavior. According to the American Optometric Association (AOA), children should have their first eye exam at 6 months of age. By this age, babies should be able to focus, see color, and have depth perception. Optometrists make sure their eyes are developing normally, checking for signs of near or farsightedness, lazy eye, crossed eyes, or severe cases such as cancer. Dr. Cindy stopped by the center last month to perform a quick and simple vision screening on the children. A copy of the results has been sent home with your child. If you'd like to opt out of this event in the future, please let us know. In addition, if you have any questions, please feel free to reach out to our center as well. Thank you, Dr. Cindy!
