PACCC Partners with Youth Community Service

Beginning on November 1, PACCC will partner with **Youth Community Service** (YCS) in an 8-week Life Skills Workshop that helps 4th and 5th grade students transition into Middle School. Regional Coordinator, Kandice Mitchell is the YCS liaison, which is now in its second year at PACCC and has grown to 6 PACCC locations.

"YCS was founded in 1990 as a collaboration between the cities of Palo Alto and East Palo Alto, and the Palo Alto Unified and Ravenswood School Districts." Its 3 primary focus areas are Peer Leadership, Social-Emotional Learning and Wellness, and Service-Based Learning.

Every workshop runs approximately 30-45 minutes with a different theme designed to help create an honest and open discussion around everyday challenges including peer pressure, what students need from the adults in their lives, and how to navigate a world full of choices that they may have not been exposed to before Middle School. Curriculum topics include Self-esteem, Decision Making, Smoking Information, Advertising, Dealing with Stress, Communication Skills, Social Skills, and Assertiveness.

All parents receive a program flier and can opt out of the Life Skills Workshop for their child. Parental feedback is always encouraged and valued at PACCC.
